





Msgr. Fiedorczyk was born in 1910 in New Britain, Connecticut, and was ordained as a Priest in 1935, and entered the Service in 1943. His first assignment was with the 69th at Camp Shelby. In World War II, he served with the 79th Infantry Division. Later he served two tours in Korea, once as Division Chaplain of the 24th Infantry Division, and served two post War tours in Germany, one as Division Chaplain 3rd Armored Division under General Creighton Abrams (who was later Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army). Stateside assignments were Student Chaplain School Harvard University, Camp Shelby, Mississippi, Camp Pickett, Virginia, Ft. Belvoir, Virginia, Hq. Sixth U.S Army Presidio San Francisco, California, and Post Chaplain Ft. McClellan, Alabama.

Decoratons; Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, French Croix de Guerre (with Fouragere), World War II Campaign Medal (with four battle stars), World War II Victory Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Army of Occupation Medal, and Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal.

One of these men, Bernard Wilson, is known to me. I regret to inform you and his other former Comrades, that Barney lost his life in a helicopter crash in Alaska during the summer of 1976. I did not know

Barney when we were in the 69th, because we were in different Regiments. We met many years later as fellow employees of Shell Oil Company; however, we did not realize that we had both served in the 69th until 1974, when we began working in the same Division Office.

After his discharge from the Army, Barney resumed his studies at the University of Miami, graduating in 1946 with a degree in Geology. He joined Shell in 1954 beginning a 22 year career of research and exploration for new oil and gas reserves which continued to the day he was killed. Barney and two other Shell geologists were conducting a field reconnaissance progam when their helicopter crashed into a mountainside. There were no survivors. Shell Oil Company lost three valued employees that day, but to those of us who knew them, the loss was personal and painful. Barney's family had his ashes scattered from the air over the rugged Alaskan landscape, where he had spent many personally rewarding days in the pursuit of his chosen profession.




Company F-271st Infantry — Camp Shelby, Mississippi - August, 1943





The assistant squad leader was Sergeant John Westlake originally from Patchogue, New York. His family moved to Connecticut and after the war, John moved to Dalla, Texas. When we were in Arizona for our first Reunion West, I was talking with him about five in the morning and we had an enjoyable chat about the 69th. I understand he has moved backed to Connecticut.

My best buddy in my squad was, and still remains, Fred Butenhoff, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Others in my squad: Joe Amaral, Al Powell, Ben Sellers, Lamar Millet, Merle Stallman, Lyn Turner, Bob Goetz and Tom Dunleavy. One other was a Silvio G. Formosa from Pennsylvania who was accidentally killed when we were traveling by truck through Leipzig, Germany. I only mention it at this time because it's still deeply etched in my mind.


